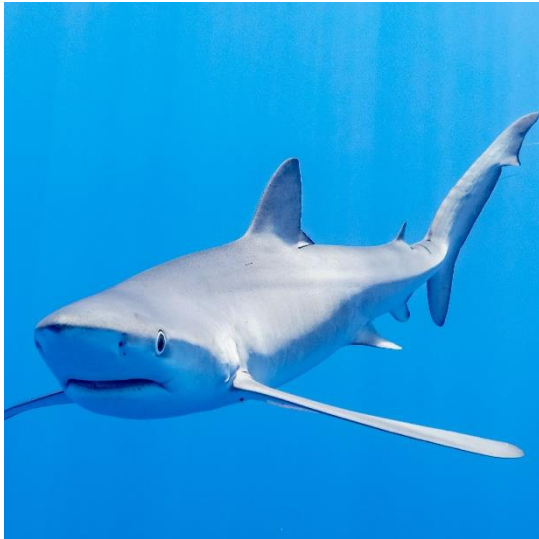


Sharks – All About the Ocean’s Apex Predators

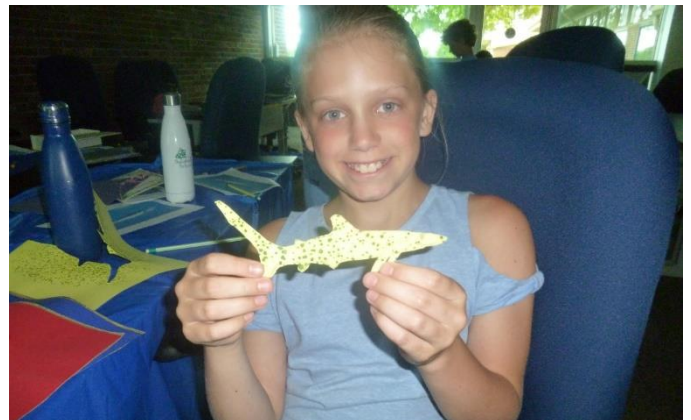
